


How does Vocational Training Work?



Training is mainly provided in the company – supported by teaching in part-time vocational school (Berufsschule)













- 3-4 days per week

Partner "Berufsschule"












- 1-2 days per week on average

- general & vocational knowledge is taught within the framework of compulsory education





Facts and Figures

- approx. 350 nationwide recognized training occupations (270 in the field of industry, trade and services)
- two out of three young people in Germany in VET
- around 1,5 million trainees, 560,000 new contracts per year
- approx. 500,000 companies providing training
- approx. 336,000 vocational training instructors only in the field of industry, trade and services
- over 160,000 professional experts work on a honorary basis in the examination boards of the Chambers of Industry and Commerce
- German businesses spend € 23 billion per year on vocational training
 - gross costs of a trainee per year for the company: € 15,300
 - return on investment through productive activity: € 11,700
 - net costs of a trainee per year: just € 3.600
- costs of a trainee per year for the vocational school: € 2,200



Everyone benefits from Vocational Training

Benefits for enterprises and trade unions:

- influence on content and organization of training
- at medium-term: low recruitment costs
- next generation of skilled workers assured

Benefits for trainees:

- labor market relevant training leads to excellent job perspectives
- acquisition of social skills within the real life of a company
- motivation by getting training fees (earning and learning)
